

Chapter 67

§ 67-1. Fires upon paved streets or other public property.

No person shall build, kindle, add fuel to, maintain or permit a bonfire or fire of any character whatsoever upon or adjacent to any pavement, curb, sidewalk, tree, shrubbery or grass within or upon any street, parkway, park or other public property in the Village of Kensington.

§ 67-2. Prohibited outdoor fires; exceptions.

No person shall set fire to or burn or cause to be burned any rubbish, building materials, wastepaper, leaves or garden refuse or other materials, in open fires or in closed receptacles, in any area, public or private, within the confines of the Village of Kensington. This chapter, however, shall not be deemed to prohibit the burning of fuel of any nature in indoor or outdoor heating or cooking apparatus. No person shall start or maintain a fire of any type, either open or in a receptacle, on any public pavement within the village.

§ 67-3. Penalties for offenses.¹

Each person who violates any provision of this chapter shall, for each and every day that said violation continues, be subject to a fine of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.) or imprisonment for a period not to exceed six (6) months, or both such fine and imprisonment.
